#### **Context:**

Many underrepresented students — including those with **Special Educational Needs (SEN)** and from **Ethnically Diverse (ED) communities**—face significant barriers to workplace exposure and often struggle to secure meaningful internship opportunities.

This mentorship program is designed to breaks down these barriers by pairing students with professionals. Through one-on-one mentoring, skill-building workshops, and exclusive internships, participants gain personalized guidance, real-world insights, confidence, and networks to thrive in today's job market.

# About the Program

As a mentee, you will engage in 4 x one-to-one mentoring sessions that will centre around a discussion of your career goals. This is an opportunity to review practical skills for job application process. You can also discuss about your previous experiences, your skillset, professional plans, and your career and education pathways.

## Other activities may include:

- Reviewing your resume and cover letters
- Practicing mock interviews
- Visiting worksites
- Networking with other professionals
- Discussing workplace accommodations and adjustments
- Building your confidence

## What are you committing to?

- Attending 4 x one-on-one mentoring sessions over 4 months (online or in your mentor's offices)
- 60 minutes per session
- Flexible scheduling in mutual agreement between you and your mentor

## **About you**

To be eligible, you must be aged 18–25, either with <u>Special Educational Needs (SEN)</u> or <u>from an Ethnically</u> <u>Diverse (ED) background</u>, and currently pursuing an Associate's, Higher Diploma, or Bachelor's degree.
